Anxiety Disorders and Substance Abusers

There is an increasing body of evidence suggesting that clients with substance abuse problems experience a significant degree of anxiety. Dual diagnosis of concurrent substance abuse and anxiety disorders is likely to increase treatment effectiveness. This class will focus on generalized anxiety disorder, social anxiety disorder, panic disorder, and agoraphobia. Treatment of these disorders from a cognitive-behavioral model will be presented.

Clients with both a mental illness and substance abuse disorder present opportunities for the therapist to address both issues simultaneously in their treatment planning. What is the counselor's first concern-achieving abstinence or medication evaluation? How does the counselor promote stability and involve community support systems? Personality disorders and limitations to treatment will be covered as well as developing a prioritized list of treatment goals. The participant will become familiar with the use of medication to treat co-existing disorders and practice diagnosing both substance abuse disorders and mental illness.

DBT (Dialectical Behavior Therapy)

Dialectical Behavior Therapy, developed by Marsha M. Linehan, Ph.D. at the University of Washington, is a comprehensive cognitive-behavioral treatment for borderline personality disorder, especially for those with severe dysfunctional behaviors. Research has shown DBT to effectively reduce suicidal behavior, dropout from treatment, psychiatric hospitalization, anger, interpersonal difficulties and substance use. This class is for those who want to learn the principles and specific protocols in DBT. It is designed for those who want to learn to teach DBT skills or to use the tools of DBT in individual therapy. Instructor will use lecture, videotape, skills practice assignments, role-play, homework review, and question and answer to provide participants with a practical and highly experiential learning environment.

Jurisprudence means the practice of therapy in Colorado and the law. Requirements for jurisprudence have changed and now require only a mail-in exam, which is submitted directly to the DORA. This elective workshop provides information pertinent to the exam. A passing score of 80% on the exam is needed as a requirement for licensure or listing in the Grievance Board Database in Colorado.

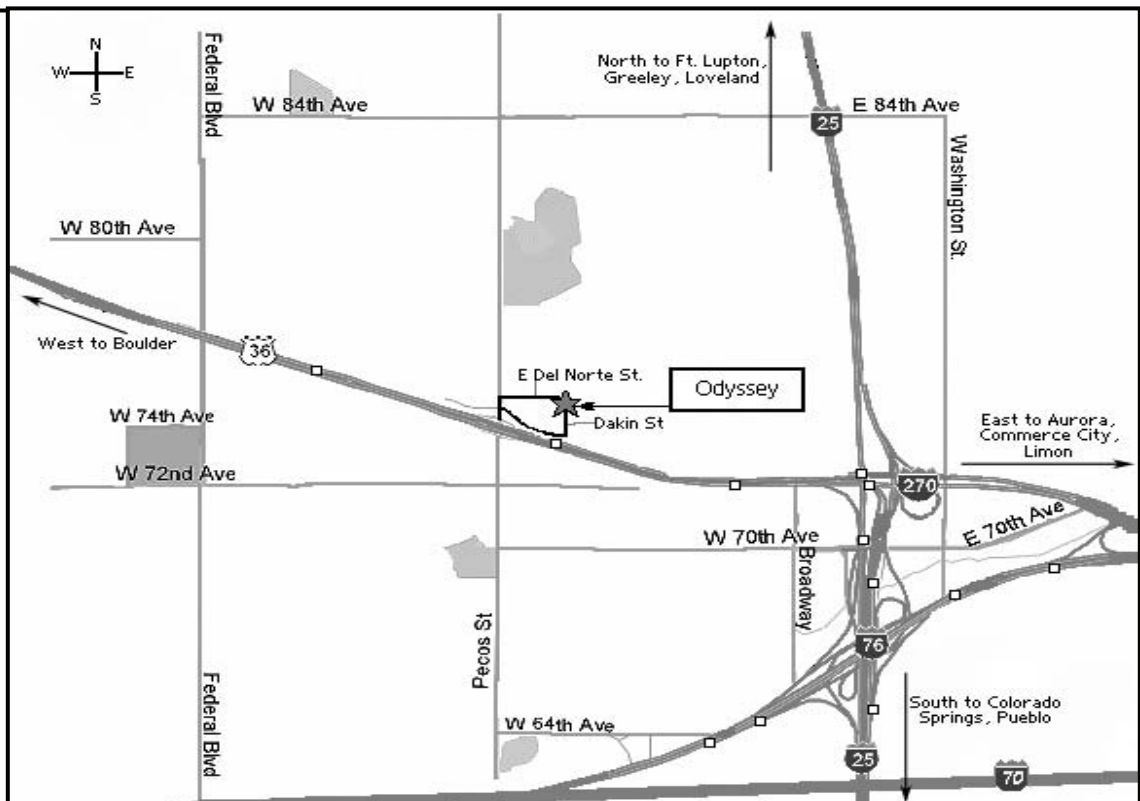
